

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Livestock exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor for at least two months prior to the Show.
2. All exhibitors must pay €8.00 admission to the Show.
3. The Show Society acting through its Officers may refuse entry.
4. The Show Society while cataloguing the exhibits will not accept liability for any error in the numbering of exhibits, for any exhibit not being displayed, or loss of, accident or damage to any exhibit.
5. The Judges may withhold a prize in class in which, in their opinion, there is not sufficient merit. The Judges decision to 'merit' will be final.
6. Subject to the Judges decision, no prize will be awarded in a class unless there are at least two exhibits. No second prize unless there are four exhibits and no third prize unless there are six exhibits.
7. In classes where there are ten or more entries, the Judges may award an additional prize, if exhibits in their opinion warrant it. In the case of only one exhibit in a class, the Judge may award a merit prize if the exhibit in his opinion warrants it.
8. No exhibit will be removed from the Show Grounds without permission from the Chief Steward, whose name will appear in the Show Catalogue.
9. Any statement of ownership wrongly, intentionally or otherwise made on the Entry Form (in the opinion of the Committee) automatically disqualifies the exhibitor.
10. Any objections regarding a Class or Classes must be lodged in writing with the secretary within half an hour of judging of the incident, accompanied by a deposit of €20.00 which will be forfeited if the objection is not sustained or considered to be frivolous.
11. The society reserves the right to postpone any Show or part thereof, definitely or indefinitely, without incurring any liability to any exhibitor or any other party.
12. To avoid any confusion regarding Perpetual Cups at Ballyshannon Show, a Perpetual Cup goes on forever and cannot be won outright.
13. All entries must be received on or before the 2nd August 2011. No late entries will be accepted. Entry fees must be paid when entering, otherwise the entry will not be accepted.
14. All cups must be returned to the Society by 1st July 2011.
15. An exhibitor will not be awarded more than two first prizes with the same animal.
16. Any incorrect entries for Classes in the Horse & Pony section will be disqualified.
17. All cattle must comply with the Department of Agriculture test regulations.
18. No Steward can officiate in a ring who is an exhibitor or family member of an exhibitor.
19. Any exhibitor found to be intimidating judges/stewards will be removed from the show, not receive any prize money and will also receive a 1 year ban from exhibiting at the Ballyshannon Agricultural Show.

**SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS - CATTLE**  
**Animal Health Status**

**T.B.**

All animals must come from herds, which are not restricted, and the herd and relevant animals must have had a clear test within the previous twelve months. No pre-movement test is required for T.B. However, it is recommended by the Department that a 30-day pre-movement test for TB should apply to all Shows.

**Brucellosis**

- (a) All animals must come from herds which are not restricted.
- (b) Certain animals (i.e. females aged 18 months and over and bulls aged 24 months and over) must have passed a test for Brucellosis within the previous 60 days. However, these animals may move to any number of Shows within the validity period of the same 60-day pre-movement test.

Where such an animal(s) is/are being shown repeatedly during successive 60-day validity periods, in the course of a Show season, the animal(s) may be allowed to move on foot of Permit ER 36A during the unexpired portion of a valid test where the animal is under test for the next validity period and the identity card/passport is held by the DVO/practitioner.

**Identification**

All cattle must bear double plastic tags as issued under the Department's identification system. They must be accompanied by their passports (except in the circumstances outlined in the preceding sub-paragraph).

**Bulls for A.I. Stations**

In addition to the T.B. and Brucellosis tests, bulls destined for A.I. stations must be tested for I.B.R. (Infectious Bovine Rhynotracheitis), E.B.L. (Enzootic Bovine Leukosis), B.V.D. (Bovine Virus Diarrhoea) and Johnes Disease, within 30 days prior to movement into such stations.

**AIM Notification**

The movement of Irish-registered cattle to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on AIM using form CMMS 4 (available from local DVOs). Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling this requirement lies with the Show Secretary.

The keeper of the animal(s) should complete sections 2 and 3(a) of the CMMS 4 form while Section 3(b) should be completed by the Show Secretary. Completed forms should be sent to the District Veterinary Office in the county where the Show is being held within 7 days of movement.

**Imports from Northern Ireland**

It is very important that any proposal to import cattle to a show is made known to the local District Veterinary Office well in advance so that consideration can be given to compliance with the requirements outlined below.

**Premises**

The Show premises at which the cattle will reside for the duration of their stay must either be an assembly centre approved for exports or of such a standard as being capable of being approved for such a purpose temporarily. A fundamental requirement for such

premises is that they have surfaces that are capable of being cleaned and disinfected, and have adequate cleaning and disinfection facilities.

Adequate segregation facilities may be required also (see under "Status of Animals" below).

### **Status of Animals**

Cattle from Northern Ireland being moved to a show must be certified in accordance with the normal requirements for intra-community trade in breeding animals including having passed a TB test (export interpretation) during the 30 days prior to export and a brucellosis test in the case of eligible animals (females and entire males over 12 months) during the 30 days prior to leaving the herd of origin.

To comply with eligibility requirements for re-importation into Northern Ireland after the show, cattle must not mix with any cattle of a lesser health status whilst at the show. This can be achieved in one of two ways: (i) either the imported animals are kept segregated fully from other cattle at the show which have not been tested, or (ii) all cattle attending the show must have been TB tested (export interpretation) within 30 days and all cattle from Northern Ireland attending the show must have been brucellosis tested within 30 days as set out above.

### **Documentation**

Cattle imported to a show from Northern Ireland must be accompanied by an original breeding animal intra-trade health certificate (known as a TRACES certificate) and a passport for each animal. A TRACES message, corresponding with the TRACES certificate, will be sent for each animal or consignment being dispatched to the show (this will be performed by officials in the dispatching country). For the return journey, this original certificate must be endorsed by the signature of the official veterinarian of the Department at the show, together with the official stamp of the competent authority and date of endorsement. A TRACES message will be sent for the return journey also (this will be performed by Department officials attending the show).

In addition, a non-comminglement certificate must be issued by the official veterinarian for the show at or before return, stating that the animal shows no clinical signs of disease and has not been in contact, during its stay at the show/event, with animals of a lesser health status. The passport must accompany the animal on the return journey also.

The Show Secretary should complete a CMMS 5 form in respect of animals imported to take part in the Show. The owner of the imported animal(s) is required to sign the form also when the animal arrives at the Show and provide his/her herd number. Following the Show, the official veterinarian should complete the bottom portion of the CMMS 5 form also confirming that he has stamped the official Health Certificate and that he has issued a Non-Comminglement Certificate.

The completed CMMS 5 form should then be forwarded to NBAS Division, Administration Building, Backweston Campus, Backweston, Celbridge, Co Kildare to enable recording of the movement. A carbon copy of the form will be provided for the Show Secretary, the official veterinarian and the herd keeper of the animal(s).

CMMS 5 forms are available from local District Veterinary Offices (DVOs) or from the Cattle Movement Notification Agency, Clonakilty, Co Cork.

**IMPORTANT:**

It is recommended by the Irish Show Association that all Exhibitors would have their own insurance cover.

## LIVESTOCK SECTION

It has been decided by the Show Society that all Exhibitors with entries value of €40 or above will receive a pass to be presented at the gate to admit 1 person in to the showgrounds.

Cattle Classes: Judging starts at 11a.m. sharp.

### Exhibitors Please Note:

1. All cattle must be accompanied by identity cards and must comply with current government regulations.
2. All cattle classes are open unless otherwise stated.
3. Cattle for exhibition at the Show must be in the Show Grounds by 10a.m.
4. Cattle entered in non haltered classes can not enter haltered classes.
5. Livestock exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor for at least two months prior to the Show.
6. Any exhibitor found to be intimidating judges/stewards will be removed from the show, not receive any prize money and will also receive a 1 year ban from exhibiting at the Ballyshannon Agricultural Show.

## **SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS - SHEEP**

Animal Health Status

### **Identification**

All sheep must be identified individually with appropriate ear tags issued in accordance with the requirements of the National Sheep Identification System (NSIS).

### **Movement Documentation**

All consignments of sheep being moved must be accompanied by a completed dispatch document. Individual details of each sheep in the consignment must be recorded on the document. Sheep from non-restricted flocks only can be moved to shows. In the case of flocks restricted following diagnosis of scrapie, sheep possessing the ARR/ARR genotype only may be exhibited. The movement of these ARR/ARR genotype sheep must be accompanied by the relevant movement permit (SCR/10), which can be obtained from the local District Veterinary Office in the county where the flock is located.

Flock Register

All movements of sheep to and from shows must be recorded in the keeper's flock register.

### **Exports to Northern Ireland**

All sheep must be accompanied by a TRACES infra trade certificate for ovine animals. A TRACES message, corresponding with the TRACES certificate, will be sent for each animal or consignment being dispatched to the show (this will be performed by Department officials of the DVO). Exhibitors are advised to contact the show society in Northern Ireland well in advance of any show to determine the suitability of the show for return of animals (e.g. premises and sheep status), and whether the authorities will have officials and veterinary staff present to supervise and process documentation for animals returning to origin.

Agreement for the movement and immediate return of sheep to a Show in another country or vice versa currently applies for movements between Ireland and Northern Ireland only — it does not apply for movements to Great Britain or further afield. Movements to shows other than Northern Ireland, will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis and you should contact your local District Veterinary Office at least one month prior to the Show .

Attendance of sheep from scrapie monitored flocks at shows and sales in 2011 Shows between 1st May and 31st October

Sheep from Scrapie Monitored Flocks will be permitted to attend Agricultural Shows taking place between 1st May and 31st October, without restriction or separation from other categories of sheep.

Shows outside of the 1st May and 31st October Period

For shows taking place before 1st May or after 31st October, sheep from Scrapie Monitored or Probationary Flocks must be separated from other sheep as set down below.

1. This championship is confined to Irish Draught 2 Year old Fillies, the progeny of a Registered Irish Draught Mare or appendix Mare and R.I.D. Stallion, who have qualified at selected I.S.A. Shows this season.
2. Each entry must have her passport available for checking by the I.S.A. Representative, both at the Qualifying Show and at the Final to confirm that she is eligible to compete. No Filly will be allowed to compete unless her passport is in order.
3. Two Animals in each qualifying class may be selected to compete in the final provided the judges agree the standard is high enough.
4. One of the judges at the qualifying show must be from the Irish Draught Horse Society list.
5. Animals Qualified for Final are not eligible to enter any other class at Limerick show.

5. One qualifier per show or two qualifiers if the standard is high enough at the judge's discretion.
6. On completion of judging, stewards must inform the successful competitor to visit the secretary's office at the qualifying show within one hour and complete the

necessary documentation for entry to the final. Note it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to make sure his/her foal is entered for the final.

7. Show secretaries must forward the completed result cards, together with appropriate fee to the Oughterard show secretary within 5 days of holding the qualifying class.
8. The Oughterard show in consultation with the sponsor reserve the right to amend the rules as may be necessary.

## **RACEHORSE TO RIDING HORSE IRELAND**

### **1st Class**

Training class within the confines of the Show Ring - The judges do not ride but score on control obedience etc,

A score sheet is completed in respect of all competitors and is available after the class. There will be a prize for best turned out and a prize for the best placed veteran horse (over 15 yrs).

Open to thoroughbred horses who have raced, either track or p2p, and must not have won more than 3 classes in either Training or Novice nor won an open class under Racehorse to Riding Horse Ireland rules Nor won or placed in the first three at a championship show such as Dublin, Balmoral, Hickstead, Wembley nor won a County Show class as a hunter hack or ridden horse.

Passport and racing details to be available on day of the show, competitors to have attained their 15th birthday - proper show turnout essential.

The format: the horse will perform walk trot canter (on the correct leg) on each rein, gallop returning to halt which is maintained for 5 seconds

### **2nd class:**

Racehorse to Riding Horse Ireland Open Ridden class open to all thoroughbred horses who have raced either track or p2p - passport and racing details to be made available on the day of the show. Competitors to have attained their 15th birthday - proper show turnout essential.

The format: the horse will perform walk trot canter (on the correct leg) gallop, halt

(maintained for 5 seconds) and a few steps of rein back, the judge will also ride the horse in this class - a score sheet will be completed by the judges, on all competitors and will be available after the class

Racing injuries blemishes etc are not taken into consideration in these classes

Bad manners from either horse and/or rider, may result in being asked to leave the ring In the event of a tie the judges preference will decide, the winner, **THE JUDGES DECISION IS FINAL**
